"The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth." — John 1:14

The season of Advent reminds us to prepare our hearts for celebrating the birth of Jesus. Its name comes from the Latin word adventus, which means "coming."

I know that you agree that there's way more to Christmas than the tree, decorating, gifts, Black Friday shopping, and Santa Claus. But in all the busyness, if we don't make an intentional effort within our families, we risk missing what Advent is all about! Every year I say that I want less "hustle and bustle" and more "simple and sacred".

Here at Zion, we are going to light the first candle on the Advent wreath. This candle is the light of HOPE. Some of you reading this may have lost hope this year. Maybe life has been difficult for you financially or with health concerns. You might be worried because it seems a family member has lost their way, or maybe you've lost someone you love. Scripture reminds us we still have hope!


