Let us together build a church that is truly unconditional, a beacon of hope and hospitality to all.



However, all children of Zion and their parent(s) are strongly encouraged to attend regularly as part of the catechism.

First of all, THANK YOU for your financial gifts in 2024! We will provide 2024 giving statements in your mailboxes by the end of January.

As I mentioned at the annual meeting, we are blessed in many ways at Zion, but the growth of our giving has not kept pace with the growth of expenses, or the growth we have been blessed to receive spiritually and in the increased number of new members. Overall giving has gone down in each of the last two years. In order for us to fulfill our missions and obligations, and to maintain our properties, we ask you to prayerfully consider increasing your giving in 2025.

Guidance for SPECIAL OFFERINGS (Pink Envelopes)

- 1. Denominational Assessments to ARC once each in January and July of \$26 per adult member.
- 2. Cemetery support once each in April and October of an amount that you are spiritually inspired to give.
- 3. Outreach support once each in March and September as you are spiritually inspired.
- 4. Capital Maintenance support once each in February, May, August and November (in anticipation of roof replacement in the next two years.)

Giving regularly helps us manage budgets and cash flows more effectively than occasional offerings. Please consider giving even when church is cancelled, or you are unable to attend for other reasons. If you would like guidance on determining an amount of offering, or have an interest in having your offering set up on auto-pay, please let me know, and I will be happy to help.


