Financial Update by BRENDA VAN BEEK

Our churches continue to support the Network's activity with faithful Partnership Offerings, and as a result, our financial condition remains healthy. At the Annual Meeting, each church received a binder with a January-September 2024 budget report and the 2025 budget(which was approved during the meeting). Throughout the year, our admin team noted that our income was greater than anticipated, so we were able to support our churches in new ways during 2024: Mallory Schouten was hired to help with communication and engagement; a "Being Reformed" class for Pathways candidates is being held in partnership with Horizon Network; our first Pastors' Retreat was held at Inspiration Hills: new teams have been launched for renewal and multiplication; and our Annual Meeting lunch got an upgrade, too. It is our prayer that our churches continue to enjoy strong support from Network initiatives in 2025 and beyond!
